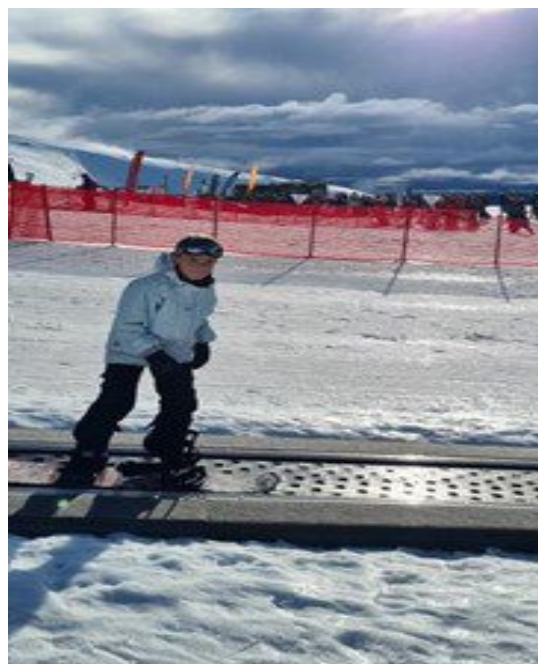
Amelia has been awarded the Direct Theatre School Yolanda Moore award for 2023 for outstanding performance as well as consideration and support to other students.
